

Surbiton High School is a campus-style school with a number of different buildings that you will move between during the school day. Highlighted below are the main buildings used by the Senior School pupils.

Surbiton Assembly Rooms



Where do you think a love of languages could take you in the future?







Dance Studio



During our pupils' time at Surbiton High School, they are prepared for life beyond the School, through regular practice of the 17 learning habits on the wheel below.



Find the Words that Speak to you

Have you ever read a book and found that some words 'speak' to you? They stand out and leap from the page, swirling around in your imagination. Noticing how literature affects us is all part of the joy of English and one way to do this is by creating blackout poetry.

Take a page of a story, any story. It need not be a novel. A play. A poem. Any piece of literature will do (we have included 'Alice in Wonderland' below if you want to use that). Read it through a couple of times. Stare at the words - a bit like you would for a 'magic eye' picture. Notice the words which 'speak' to you. Circle these. Then see if you can make any connections between the words. Are they on the same theme? Do they all create the same mood?

What happens if you add in some of the function words (the conjunctions and prepositions, for example) to join the words together? Play and have fun with it. There are no rules and there certainly is no 'right' or 'wrong' way to do this.

Once you have circled as many, or as few, words as you want, shade out all the rest so that all that's left are your words intermingled with the original author's. Notice the shape you have made and the meanings you have created. A piece of literature that's yours. You could even draw a picture through the words you don't want - like the samples below.






Curriculum Overviews


